AND PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF JEWISH CHARITIES (LATER NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF JEWISH SOCIAL WORK) 1904-06, AND NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF SOCIAL WORK, 1912. IN 1917 HE WAS ELECTED FIRST PRESIDENT OF THE NATIONAL ORGANIZATION OF YOUNG MEN'S AND YOUNG WOMEN'S HEBREW ASSOCIATIONS. HE ALSO SERVED AS PRESIDENT OF THE IMMIGRANTS PROTECTIVE LEAGUE, FRIENDS OF RUSSIAN FREEDOM AND INFANTS WELFARE SOCIETY, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MICHAEL REESE HOSPITAL, VICE PRESIDENT OF THE CHILDRENS HOSPITAL SOCIETY AND SOCIETY FOR SOCIAL HYGIENE AND A DIRECTOR OF JEWISH CHARITIES ALL OF CHICAGO. HE WAS AN OVERSEER OF HARVARD UNIVERSITY FOR THREE TERMS AND A MEMBER OF THE AMERICAN, ILLINOIS, CHICAGO AND NEW YORK CITY BAR ASSOCIATIONS, HARVARD, LITERARY, LAW, CAXTON AND CITY CLUBS OF CHICAGO, COSMOS CLUB OF WASHINGTON, D. C., HARVARD, CITY, GROLIER, TOWN HALL, CIVIC, HARDWARE AND AUTOMOBILE CLUBS OF NEW YORK CITY AND HARVARD CLUB OF BOSTON. IN POLITICS HE WAS A DEMOCRAT. MACK WAS MARRIED TWICE: (1) IN CINCINNATI, MAR. 9, 1896, TO JESSIE, DAUGHTER OF SOLOMON FOX, A DIAMOND MERCHANT OF THAT CITY; SHE DIED IN 1938, LEAVING ONE DAUGHTER, RUTH, WHO MARRIED MARK BRUNSWICK; (2) IN NEW YORK CITY, SEPT. 4, 1940, TO CECILE (BLUMGART) BRUNSWICK, DAUGHTER OF LOUIS BLUMGART, A NEW YORK MANUFACTURER, AND WIDOW OF EMMANUEL BRUNSWICK. HE DIED IN NEW YORK CITY, SEPTEMBER 5, 1943.
